The Dictionary Project	Cuero Jr. High School And Hunt Elementary	800+	\$1,375.00	This grant is to help all students in grades 3-8 grow as good writers, active readers, and creative thinkers by providing a personal dictionary for each one to utilize. The end product will be an increase in vocabulary.
2. Operation Good Heart	Cuero High School	700+	\$2,800.00	This proposal's purpose is to prevent catastrophic death of students, staff, parents and other school visitors by providing a defibrillator initially at the High School campus.
3. Shattered Dreams	Cuero High School	300	\$1,350.00	This project is designed to educate high school students of the devastating consequences of underage drinking. The program realistically and powerfully simulates the physical, emotional, social, and legal consequences of underage drinking and provides a proactive approach to address this problem.
4. Our Goal: No Child Left Behind	Hunt Elementary	250	\$5,000.00	This project will fund multiple sets of leveled guided reading books for small group instruction for all students in grades 2 and 3.
5. Phonics Across The Curriculum	John C. French	100+	\$2,500.00	This grant will enhance the curriculum by incorporating additional "hands on" materials, manipulatives, and supplies into the Pre-K, PPCD classes, and the most at risk classes at John C French Elementary.
6. Beowulf – Alive!	Cuero High School	170	\$5,000.00	This grant is to bring Benjamin Bagby to CHS to perform the epic poem Beowulf in Old English and interact with English IV students. This event will center on an Anglo-Saxon setting school day consisting of costumes, decorations and light food created by students themselves.

Kurzweil Reading Project for Cuero ISD	District Wide	200+	\$4,710.00	This project is very innovative in the fact that it is the latest program available that will allow for any book or test to be scanned into a computer, which will then read the text to student for him/her to respond. The Kurzweil system specifically targets students with reading difficulties.
8. I'd Rather Be Flying	Cuero High School	100+	\$1,630.00	This grant will bring excitement to basic math classes through the use of flight planning and high quality simulation. Students will plan their own flight mission and then fly the mission they have planned.
