Lend a Helping Hand	JCF, Hunt, CJHS, CHS	\$2,000.00	When possible, the Cuero ISD Student Services Department assists Cuero ISD students whose families are struggling economically and are unable to provide their children with the necessary items to succeed in school. This grant will enable the Cuero ISD Student Services Department to assist families in need with necessities such as school supplies, dresscode-approved clothing, haircuts, glasses, and medical assistance.

CHS	\$4,906.00	The purpose of this grant is to teach computer coding to CHS students through Rover Robots and Innovator HUBS connected via NSPIRE coding/calculating devices. The ultimate goal is to help students understand how to integrate the skills needed for jobs of tomorrow into CHS science classrooms today.
Sensory Garden for Students with Special Needs	JCF, Hunt, CJHS, CHS	\$5,000.00	Students with profound disabilities rely heavily on sensory input to learn about the world around them. The purpose of this grant is to create an engaging sensory garden near the entrance of the CHS special education classroom, which would enable the students to interact with various textures, sounds, smells, and colors to facilitate learning.
Shattered Dreams	CHS	\$1,702.63	The purpose of this grant is to promote responsible decision making among high school students regarding underage drinking, impaired driving, and distracted driving by showing them how irresponsible choices can end all dreams. Students witness emergency first responders treating the scene of a mock vehicle accident as a first responder narrates the scene, which includes students acting out the injuries, deaths, and legal implications associated with the accident. Shattered Dreams is presented via the combined efforts of school administration, faculty, students, law enforcement, emergency medical services, parents, and community organizations and is an integral part of the District's drug and alcohol prevention program.
Shocking Ways To Save A Life	JCF, Hunt, CJHS, CHS	\$6,822.01	Each year more than 350,000 deaths occur from sudden cardiac arrest without warning. Nearly 22 school age children die of sudden cardiac arrest every day. This grant will enable the District to purchase four portable AED's and hard cases so that one AED can be sent with every group when traveling off campus for a field trip or extracurricular activity.
Texas Animals Puppet Theatre	Hunt	\$1,362.25	The purpose of this grant is to affirm the power of the arts as a learning tool and provide language, science, and social studies learning opportunities for fourth grade students at Hunt Elementary by incorporating Texas animal puppets in classroom instruction and assessment. Students will learn about the regions of Texas, natural resources, life cycles, food chains, adaptations, and interactions within ecosystems and will share their knowledge through classroom and grade level puppet show productions.
